

Dangerous / Hazardous goods

Have you declared it? Cargo containing dangerous goods is subject to national and international regulation.

Such Cargo must be properly declared and clearly identified as containing dangerous goods. Dangerous goods include articles and substances which are flammable, corrosive, toxic, oxidizing, explosive, radioactive, infectious, compressed gases, dangerous when wet, spontaneously combustible, organic peroxides and regulated material.

Following common personal items are hazardous and are not accepted unless booked as dangerous goods, packed and certified as per IATA's Dangerous Goods regulations.

- Perfumes / Fragrances
- Batteries (Lithium/Ion/Metal, of any kind) including laptop batteries or mobile phones.
- Aerosols
- WD40 / tools containing gases
- Lighters/Matches
